Breast Cancer

Incidence, mortality and survival for women, England, 1971–2011

Survival has increased by more than 50% since 1971



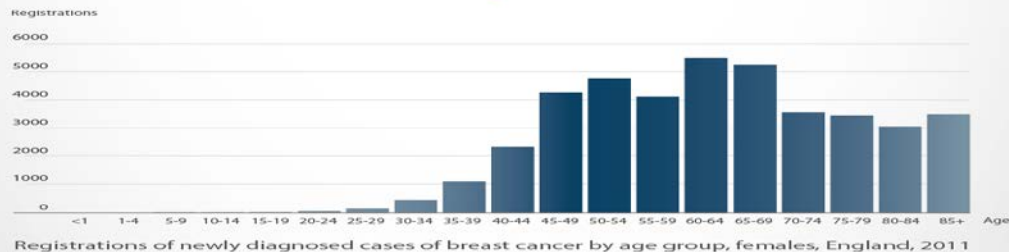
Incidence rates per 100,000 women in 2011



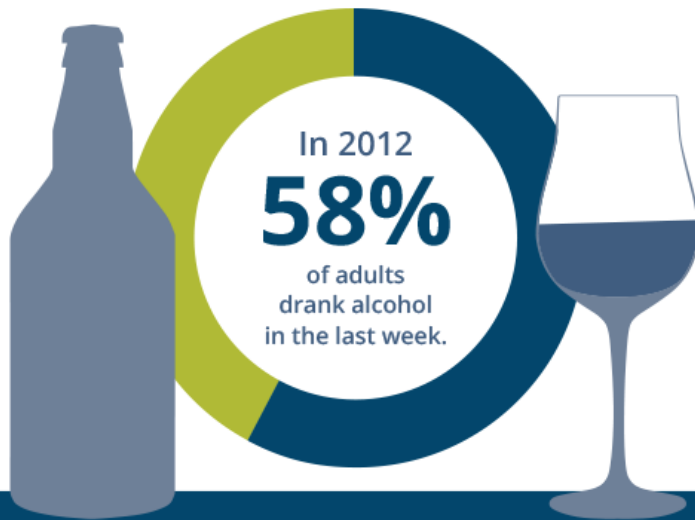
Mortality rates per 100,000 women in 2011



Breast cancer accounts for 31% of cancers in women, making it the most common cancer among women in England

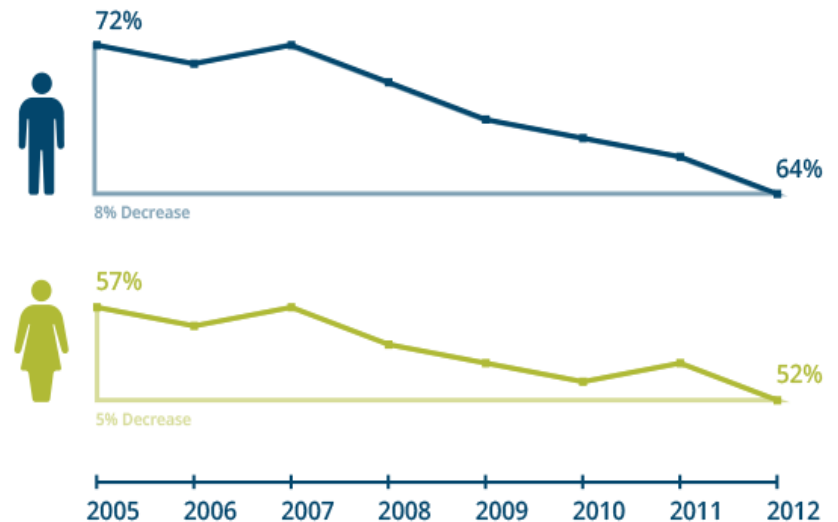

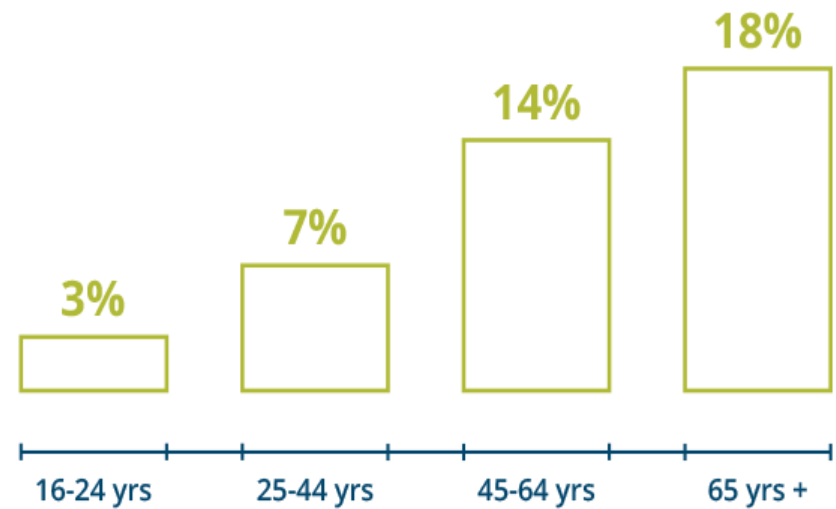

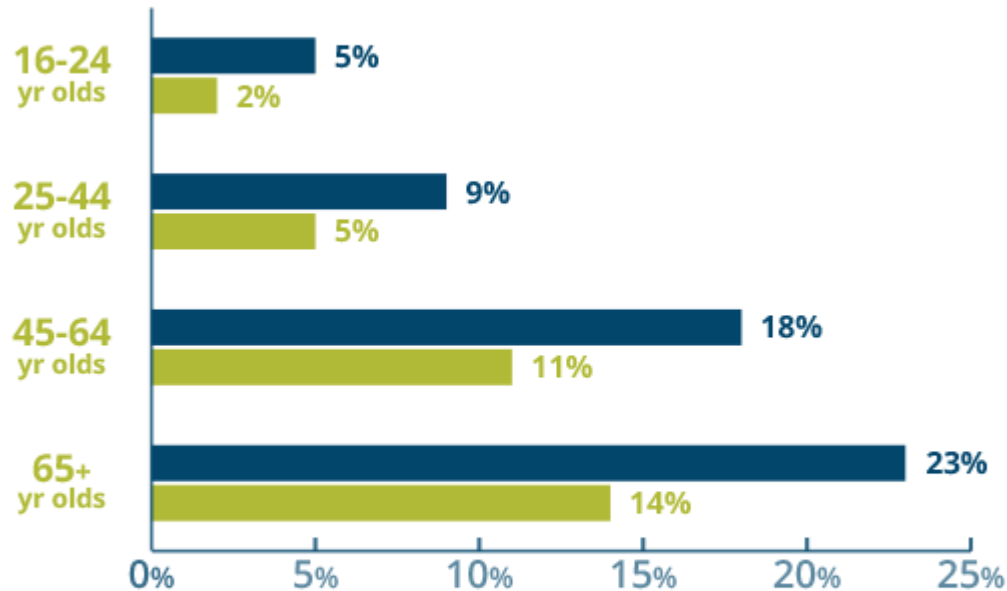

CHANCES OF SURVIVING TO AGE 100 IN 2013

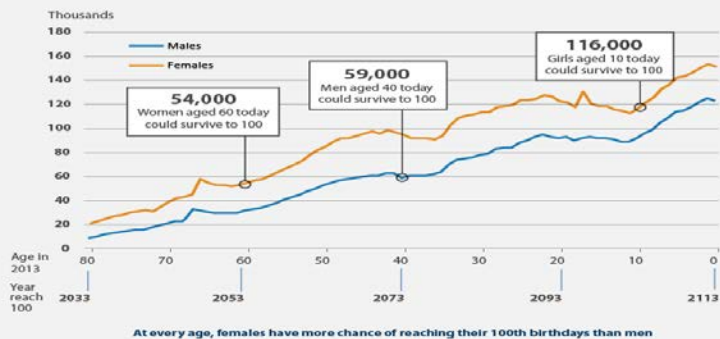


1 in 3 babies born in the UK today are expected to celebrate their **100th** birthday

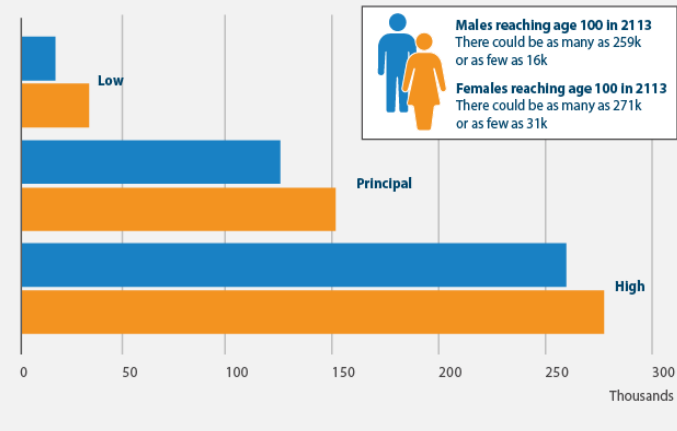
COHORT LIFE EXPECTANCY FOR THOSE BORN IN 2013

Helps to reduce levels of illness

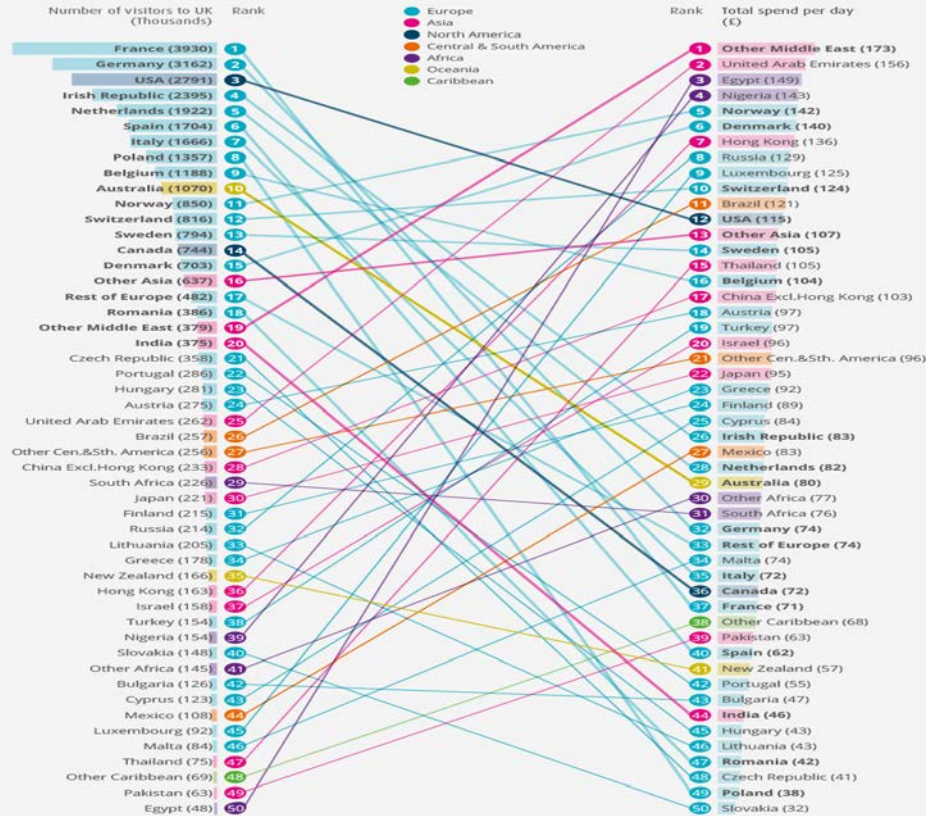

Number of visits to UK: by country of residence and spending in 2013

There were 32.8m visits to the UK in 2013, a 5.6% increase since 2012.
Over the same year, spending by overseas visitors increased by 12.7% to £21bn.

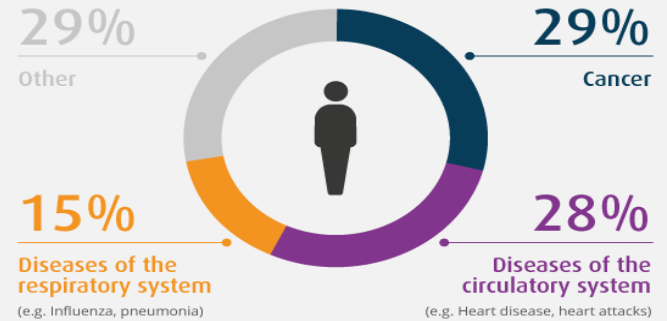

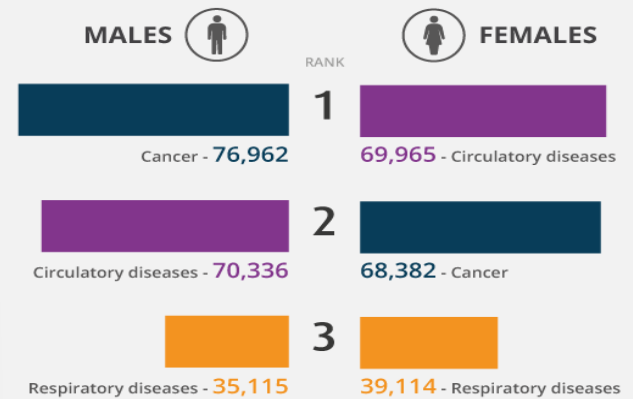

(Note: percentages shown above do not sum to 100% due to rounding.)

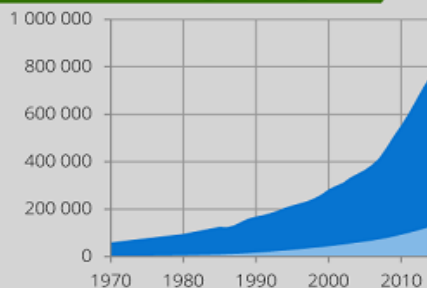
In 2013, cancer was the most common broad cause of death (29% of all deaths registered) followed by circulatory diseases, such as heart disease and strokes (28%). For males, cancer was the most common broad cause of death while for females it was circulatory diseases.

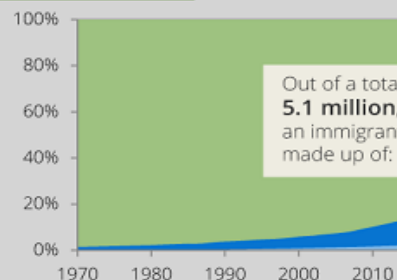

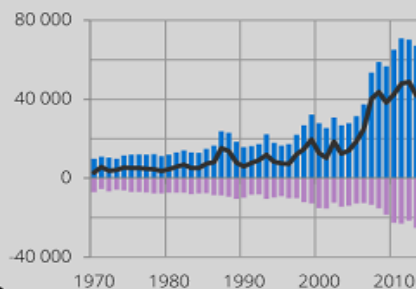

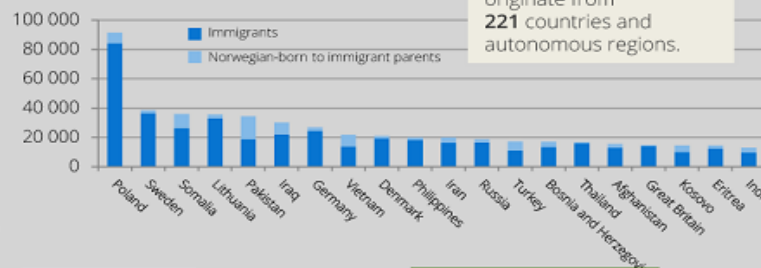

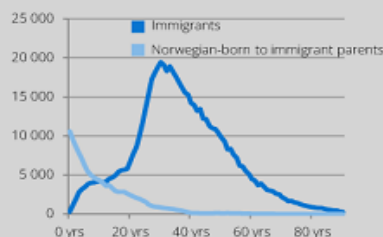

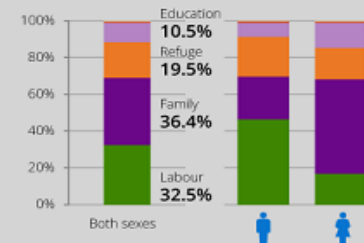
Age distribution

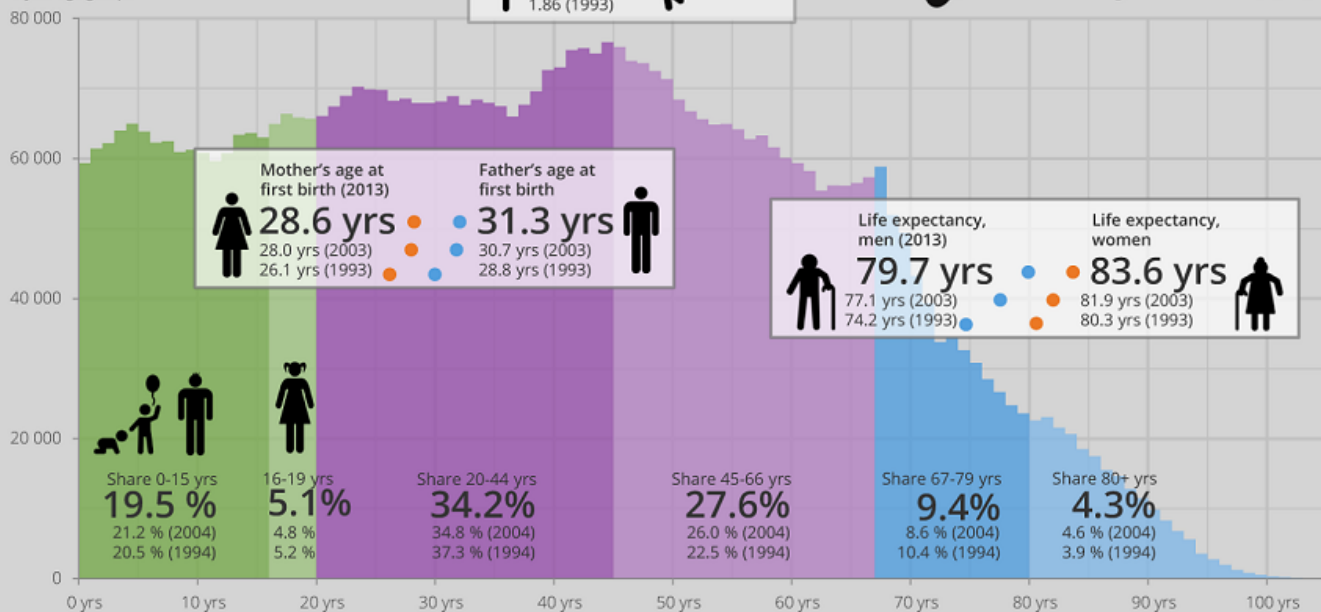

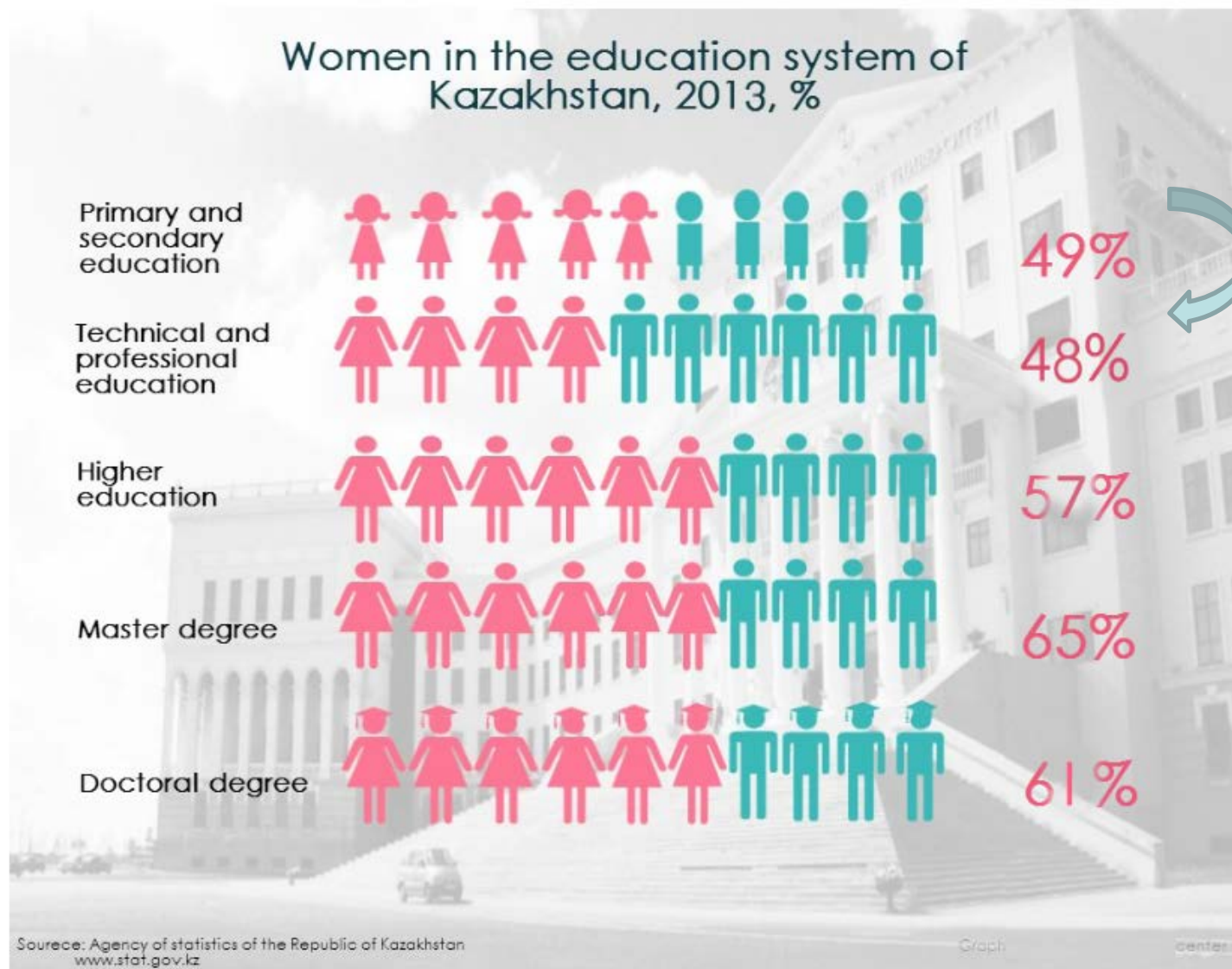
