1 Background and Objectives

Digital technologies are transforming societies, creating employment opportunities, and driving economic growth. They have significantly transformed various aspects of life, including communications, business, health, education, and finance. The World Economic Forum (WEF) has noted that the COVID-19 pandemic accelerated the Industrial Revolution 4.0, highlighting the increasing need for agility, adaptability and positive transformation. In the coming decades, approximately 70% of new value creation is expected to be driven by digitally enabled platform business models¹.

The Islamic Digital Economy (IDE) encompasses online economic activity that follow the Islamic principles and moral values. This includes the use of technology, data analytics, the internet of things (IoT), and artificial intelligence (AI). IDE covers a wide range of sectors, from e-commerce to digital payments, Islamic financial-technology, halal industries, and cybersecurity.

In 2022/23, investments in the Islamic economy, including Islamic finance, banking, tourism, and industry, reached US\$25.9 billion, representing a 128% increase on an annual basis². Looking at global Islamic financial assets, the State of the Global Islamic Economy Report (SGIE) 2023/24 sees a potential growth from US\$3.96 trillion in 2021 to US\$5.96 trillion in 2026³. OIC member countries dominate the global assets of Islamic finance, holding a share of over 95%, with consistent growth averaging around 20% per annum, despite ongoing challenges in the global financial system⁴.

Furthermore, a joint report by the Dubai Silicon Oasis Authority (DSOA), Refinitiv, and DinarStandard identified significant business opportunities in the IDE, including the sharing economy, social commerce, retail e-commerce, food transportation and logistics, and Islamic finance investment products⁵.

To further this potential, it is essential to address the inadequate national infrastructures of some OIC member countries. The digital gap between the member countries is amplified by uneven technological advancements, giving rise to the concept of “digital divide”. This divide is closely linked to development lags, with billions of people worldwide still lacking access to

Against this backdrop, SESRIC, in collaboration with the Ministry of National Development Planning (BAPPENAS) of the Republic of Indonesia and the Islamic Centre for Development of Trade (ICDT), will organise a virtual Workshop on “Islamic Digital Economy in OIC Member Countries” on 5-6 August 2024 within the framework of its Digital Capacity Building (Digi-CaB) and Halal Capacity Building (Halal-CaB) Programmes. The workshop aims to explore the IDE, highlighting successful models/business industries, and addressing the challenges and opportunities for stakeholders in this transformative sector.

2 Target Audience

The target group for this workshop includes representatives from the ministries and government agencies, central banks, academia, and relevant stakeholders in OIC member countries interested in advancing IDE.
