At the outset, I would like to express my sincere thanks to H.E. Zehra Zümrüt Selçuk and the SESRIC team for their tireless efforts in convening this Session and ensuring that all the necessary arrangements are in place for our deliberations.

I also wish to place on record our deep gratitude to H.E. Yousuf Mohamed Al Riyami, Director General of the National Center for Statistics and Information of the Sultanate of Oman, for his devoted and effective leadership during his tenure as the Chair of the 13th Session of the Commission.

His stewardship and **Oman's commitment** have advanced our collective work and left us with a solid foundation to build upon.

Furthermore, I extend my thanks to the OIC General Secretariat and the Islamic Development Bank Group for their continuous support to the Commission since its establishment in 2011. Their presence and partnership are indispensable in strengthening our shared statistical agenda.

And of course, I warmly thank all distinguished delegates, esteemed representatives of OIC, international and regional organisations, for joining us here in Ankara. Your active participation adds great value to this Session and reflects the importance you attach to our common platform.

Excellencies, Distinguished Colleagues,

As Türkiye assumes the Chairmanship of the 14th Session, on behalf of the OIC Asia Group, we do so with a deep sense of responsibility. We are determined to strengthen data cooperation and enhance statistical capacities across our Member States. We are fully aware that the challenges before us — whether in advancing education, accelerating digital transformation, or monitoring progress toward sustainable development — require timely, harmonised, and high-quality data.

As you know, at the **51st Session of the Council of Foreign Ministers of the OIC**, held in Istanbul in June 2025 under the theme "*The OIC in a Transforming World*", Türkiye outlined **three priorities** for its Chairmanship:

- Enhancing cooperation among Member States and with international partners,
- Protecting the rights of Muslim minorities and communities worldwide, and
- Strengthening capacity-building and knowledge sharing.

These priorities will continue to guide our work both at the political level of the Council of Foreign Ministers and at the technical level of the OIC-StatCom, with the clear objective of reinforcing solidarity and translating commitments into concrete actions.

In this spirit, I would like to highlight the close cooperation between TurkStat and the Secretariat of the OIC Statistical Commission, SESRIC.

Since the signing of our **Memorandum of Understanding in 2024**, we have implemented a number of joint capacity-building activities. In 2025 alone, these included:

- An online training course on Information Society and Digitalisation, conducted by TurkStat experts in April;
- An **in-person training on Labour Statistics** for the Gambia Bureau of Statistics in August;
- An **online training on Sustainable Development Statistics** for OIC Member States in September;
- The participation of a TurkStat expert in the Regional Workshop on Implementing the 2025 SNA and Compiling Digital Supply and Use Tables, held in Abu Dhabi in September; and
- A **study visit on Geospatial Data**, to be hosted by TurkStat for the Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics in October.

Additionally, this year, for the first time, TurkStat, in partnership with SESRIC, UNSD and ESCWA, co-organised a thematic side event at the Turkish House in New York in the margins of the 56th Session of the United Nations Statistical Commission, building on the resolution of the 13th Session of OIC-StatCom.

Recognised as the first thematic side event convened under the umbrella of the OIC Statistical Commission, in addition to its regular Follow-up Meetings, it successfully highlighted the statistical priorities of OIC Member States at the global stage.

Looking ahead, we are committed to continue, on a regular basis, the organisation of such thematic side events in the margins of future UN Statistical Commission sessions, with themes to be determined in line with the recommendations of the OIC-StatCom for each forthcoming session.

These examples reflect our strong commitment to contribute to the collective efforts of the OIC-StatCom. I extend my gratitude to the Member States that actively participated in these activities and to the **dedicated experts of TurkStat** and **SESRIC** who made them possible.

Looking ahead to 2026, we are determined to further expand our cooperation with **Member States**, **SESRIC**, and **relevant international** and **regional organisations** to multiply the impact of our joint work.

Excellencies, Distinguished Participants,

The Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) was founded in 1969, in response to the criminal attack on Al-Aqsa Mosque. More than five decades later, the OIC continues to uphold the same values of **unity**, **solidarity**, and **justice** that inspired its foundation.

Today, these values compel us to reaffirm, in the strongest terms, our firm solidarity with the people of Palestine, who continue to endure occupation, injustice, and unimaginable hardship.
