





Resolution #5: TQS and TQS-Youth Integration Project

- SESRIC and CDC Foundation extended the existing MoA until the end of 2025.
- Albania submitted its final report in January 2025 on the findings from the Income and Living Conditions Survey (SILC 2023).
- **Tajikistan** completed the integration of TQS-Youth into their National Household Budget Survey in May 2025.



• Total project completion status: **21 countries**.

Capacity to share best practices in collecting inclusive data for developing social protection systems:



Related to sharing knowledge and best practices on **SDG 2**, **7** out of **9** respondents who answered "Yes" mentioned a variety of topics, including:

- Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICS);
- Food Security Survey within the national statistical system;
- Agriculture Survey Manual;
- Methodologies for calculating deprivation and food security indicators.

Resolution #9: Embracing Machine Learning & Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Official Statistics





- The 13th Session reaffirmed the importance of AI and machine learning in enhancing National Statistical Systems (NSSs).
- Mandated the Secretariat to organize a side event at the 56th Session of the UN Statistical Commission.

Outcomes:

- ✓ Highlighted innovative uses of AI and digital tools for official statistics.
- ✓ Shared experiences from OIC and ESCWA member countries.
- ✓ Underlined the need for capacity building to bridge digital divides.

Resolution #11: Role of Population and Housing Censuses

 The OIC-StatCom members, completed a census under the 2020 Round of the World Population and Housing Census Programme:
