The new PoA sets out strategic priorities and key actions to strengthen national statistical systems across OIC Member States, with a focus on addressing financing gaps, reducing capacity disparities and accelerating the production of high-quality, timely data. It has been considered and structured to align with and provide the statistical basis for monitoring the new OIC Programme of Action 2026-2035, which is currently under preparation at the OIC level. The Secretariat will present the draft in detail, outlining the proposed strategic actions, implementation timeline, and key performance indicators. 14:00 – 15:15	<p><i>Role of National Statistical Offices in Supporting Data-Driven Energy Transitions</i></p> <p>Robust, comparable energy statistics are indispensable as OIC Member States pursue low-carbon growth, scale up renewables and meet their climate-related commitments. International frameworks, such as the International Recommendations for Energy Statistics and the SEEA-Energy, provide the methodological backbone for compiling energy balances, efficiency indicators and emissions data within regular production cycles. Recent SESRIC-hosted and co-organised activities on Energy Statistics and Energy-Data Ecosystems have strengthened regional capacity and fostered new partnerships in this domain. Consolidating these collaborative data ecosystems will allow NSOs to integrate administrative, utility and emerging big-data sources, closing critical gaps for tracking SDG 7 and other international energy targets. The advent of digitalization is reshaping the traditional roles of NSOs, impacting governments, businesses, and societies significantly. In this fast-evolving digital landscape, NSOs and National Statistical Systems (NSSs) must evolve to meet the increasing demands of data users by strengthening operational processes and advancing digital capabilities to support the growing data ecosystem. Successful modernization also hinges on updated statistical legislation that safeguards privacy while enabling data sharing and innovation. This session will facilitate a forum to share useful modernization roadmaps, highlight good practices and elaborate on collaborative projects to upscale digital capabilities across OIC Member States.</p>
