Background and Objectives

Investment in infrastructure and innovation are crucial drivers of economic growth and development. With over half the world population now living in cities, mass transport and renewable energy are becoming ever more important as are the growth of new industries and information and communication technologies (ICTs). Technological progress is also key to finding lasting solutions to both economic and environmental challenges such as providing new jobs and promoting energy efficiency. Promoting sustainable industries and investing in scientific research and innovation are all important ways to facilitate sustainable development.

In this connection, SDG 9 addresses three aspects of sustainable development, namely infrastructure, inclusive industrial development including a focus on small-scale enterprises, and scientific research and technological development. Being a priority SDG at the OIC level, SDG 9 is made up of 8 targets and 12 indicators of which 2 of them are in Tier II status meaning the indicator is conceptually clear, has an internationally established

methodology and standards are available but data are not regularly produced by countries.

Like any SDG indicator, monitoring of SDG 9 indicators is essential in order to support the policy makers in building resilient infrastructure, promote inclusive and sustainable industrialization and foster innovation.

Against this background, SESRIC has recently initiated the Webinar Series on Statistical Experience Sharing through which National Statistics Offices (NSOs) of OIC countries and statistical units of the relevant international agencies will find the opportunity to inform the participants about their experiences on statistical themes of mutual interest. In this connection, SESRIC will conduct a webinar jointly with the Turkish Statistical Institute (TurkStat) on their experience in SDG 9 indicators. *To enrich the content and discussions of the webinar, the other interested OIC countries are also invited to share their experiences during the Webinar.*
