







URBANISATION TRANSITION IN MALAYSIA



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






WHAT IS MURNInets 2.0?

- An acronym of "Malaysian Urban Rural National Indicators Network for Sustainable Development".
- A tool to assess the performance and sustainability level of local authorities in Malaysia.
- It enables local, state and national government to collect, store, analyse, evaluate, manage and display data relating to sustainability.
- The operation of MURNInets is headed by the Ministry of Federal Territories and the main secretariat is PLANMalaysia.





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OBJECTIVE MURNINETS



EVALUATE

 To determine the sustainability of local authorities in the country based on a set of selected indicators.

GAP-FINDING

 To identify the strengths and weaknesses of every local authority based on the performance of indicators.

ENHANCE

 To propose measures to improve and identify opportunities to raise sustainability level.

KEEP TRACK


 To establish MURNInets 2.0 as the referred tool for local authorities to monitor their sustainability level.

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CHALLENGES



ISSUES

- SDG data supply by local authorities
- Understanding of SDG metadata

SOLUTION

- Identify whether the data that can be supplied is consistent with global metadata
- Using the method of one to one discussion with local authorities
- Using form filling methods for data collection

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
