**REMARKS AT THE OPENING CEREMONY**

**ON BEHALF OF DELEGATES FROM AFRICA**

I urge colleagues to ensure that they use all the available technical assistance and exchanges between our countries. In the same breath, I congratulate SESRIC for having obtained a permanent home. Where I come from, there is a saying to the effect that when a BOY builds his own house, then HE is NO longer a child! We salute those countries that funded the building project.

Finally, we thank the government and people of Turkey for hosting us in the great City of Ankara. We all look forward to seeing other parts of the country as part of the social programme on Friday, morning.
